Sellwood Eastmoreland Southeast Portland

This tour of Southeast Portland meanders through the picturesque neighborhoods of Eastmoreland and Sellwood. The walk is on the lengthy side, but it is well worth it to see the architectural styles represented here, ranging from historic to modern. The Boutain house is a mansion of a home, coming closer than any others to the storybook ambiance of old English cottages. The Pipes house was designed by Wade Pipes, one of Portland's most eloquent spokesmen for the Arts and Crafts style. Later styles include Stripped Traditional, of which the gardenoriented Brookman house is an example, and the De Graaff house, now unfortunately remodeled, which is one of only two examples of the International style by the world-famous Richard Neutra in Oregon.

1. Parker

1929 • Arts and Crafts

2840 SE Woodstock Blvd. Entrance portal covered with a catslide extension from the upper roof and spanned with a decoratively carved lintel.

2. Howard

1927 • Mediterranean

2916 SE Woodstock Blvd.

Stepped masonry gable ends rising from the redtiled roof. Strong Dutch influence seen in carved oak panel of entrance door.

3. Eckert

1935 • Stripped Traditional

3510 SE Tolman St.

Hipped-roof house divided into three intersecting masses. Exterior walls consist of horizontal bands separated by trim boards.


4. Brookman

1931 • Stripped Traditional

3680 SE Glenwood St.

Covered entry porch with narrow columns. Office entrance features a pediment with Moderne or Art Deco carvings.

c. 1912 • Prairie

7808 SE 28th Ave.

Projecting, heavily piered entrance porch, strong horizontal lines, and window boxes supported by articulated beam-like brackets.

6. De Graaff

1940 • Modernistic/ International

6308 SE 28th Ave.

Continuous, tight-skinned exterior composed of horizontal bands defined by the roof, the windows, and the siding beneath the windows.

7. Upshaw

1935 • English Cottage

2923 SE Tolman St.

Extended rolled eaves with beam supports, and an arched roof above the entrance.

8. Boutain

1926 • English Cottage

6633 SE 29th Ave.

Massive chimney to the side of the arched entrance porch. Oriel window with a rolled eave on the front gable.

9. Mills

c. 1911 • Craftsman

7107 SE 17th Ave.

Gabled window dormer with balcony. Gabled entry porch supported by truncated-obelisk piers.

10. Pipes

1912 • Arts and Crafts

6209 SE 13th Ave.

Minimal but elegant roof and side wall detail with a stucco and lap-siding exterior.
